FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Colleagues,

Our Federation is gradually increasing its name recognition in Brussels. With increasing frequency, our Project Officer and members of our Executive Committee meet with EC officials and Members of Parliament and their assistants to discuss the role of environmental professionals. Sometimes the discussion focuses on sound environmental implementation 'on the ground', i.e. where it really matters; recently we discussed how independent professionals with all sorts of specialisms and language backgrounds could assist when an acute environmental problem somewhere in Europe requires a quick expert opinion; and always the potential of cross-border knowledge exchange our Federation offers is welcomed, as are ENEP's member services aimed at disseminating relevant information about European legislation and policies.

In light of this it has been a little disappointing that our application to the European Commission for an 'NGO Operating Grant' for funding in 2012 has

not been successful. We have made a substantial effort to prepare this grant and some frustration is therefore understandable. On the other hand, experienced 'EC watchers' indicated that it is quite common for such a grant application not to be successful the first time round, and we will therefore surely make another effort for next year. This is not only expected to have much higher chances of success, it is also necessary as our Federation needs extra funds to strengthen and extend the services our members expect. There is also a positive side-effect of our grant preparation efforts: today, the ENEP name and organisation enjoy a much wider recognition in 'Brussels' than a couple of months ago.

Meanwhile, we update our operational plan for the near future and will discuss priorities during our next General Assembly (26-27 April in Basel, hosted by our Swiss member ASEP). We look forward to meeting all members there!

Your General Secretary is writing to inform you of the outcomes of a very important ENEP meeting that took place in Brussels in February 2012: the Secretariats Meeting.

Representatives of the ENEP associations (11) came together with the desire of improving the cooperation among associations. Some of the topics analyzed and discussed were: i) 2012 is ENEP's 10th

anniversary, which represents an important mark in our history. A great deal has been achieved so far but even more will be done if we work together (see the message from our President on the subject at: <http://www.efaep.org/news/article/80/>); ii) the description of the submitted application for extra funding (EU LIFE programme), intended to increase the activities for our members; iii) new contacts made by ENEP with important

associations such as European Water Association (EWA) and the European Federation for Clean Air (EFCA); (iv) the discussion on an ENEP Code of Ethics, which we are aware is of great interest for the EU; and (v) how to improve the communication among members, associations and the external world.

In order to improve our communication I strongly believe that the ENEP Platform, which was a focal part of the discussion on the Secretariats Meeting, is the best tool that the Environmental Professionals have. Its strength lies in the fact that it is a powerful search engine, where CVs of members can be found and expertise and skills can be shared. This tool makes us different from any other social network and belongs only to ENEP, so that we are aware of the background of anyone on it. My hope is that that more and more

members will register on the Platform in order to create a communicating channel that has no comparison.

Concluding, ENEP has achieved a great deal in this past 10 years and all of us from the ExCo hope to be able to strengthen the ties among members and associations. Our aim is to promote communication and reach out to you in the best way possible (e.g. most up-to-date EU legislation).

ITM 2012

The 32nd International Technical Meeting on Air Pollution Modelling and its Application will be organised from 7-12 May 2012 in Utrecht the Netherlands.

In 1969 the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) established the Committee on Challenges of Modern Society (CCMS). From the outset, the subject of air pollution was one of the priority problems of concern to the CCMS. They initially organized a number of pilot studies, which evolved into a series of regularly-offered conferences, named NATO/CCMS International Technical

Meeting (ITM) on Air Pollution Modelling and its Application. The organization and support of these meetings has become one of the main activities of the newly constituted NATO Committee on Science for Peace and Security (SPS). The present 31st ITM continues the series, and is a confirmation of the interest and high level of confidence of the scientific community and various supporting agencies in the ITM series of conferences.
